

How does MOVA provide students with personalized education?

MOVA takes a personalized approach to education by removing barriers to learning, reaching students where they are, and providing innovative, high-quality online education solutions, curriculum, and programs.

How does a day at MOVA look?

Students participating in MOVA receive a high-quality, personalized education experience online. In online schooling serving grades K–12, the classroom is in the home or on the road, wherever an internet connection is available.

Full-time students' days include a combination of:

- Online lessons, interactive activities, and virtual classroom sessions in the Online School (OLS)
- Independent activities not on the computer using MOVA provided materials, including textbooks and workbooks
- Interaction with teachers and classmates online or by phone
- Guidance from their Learning Coach to ensure they are making progress during the day
- Planned student activities and parent support as needed

Students are expected to complete schoolwork each day and attend virtual classroom sessions as scheduled by their teachers.

More specifics by grade and age levels...

Kindergarten through 2nd grade

Students

- Students will attend 3 – 4 hours of live classes Monday – Thursday, Fridays there will be approximately 1 hour of class time.
- Some students will be required to attend support sessions to assist the student in their learning.
- Help sessions will be held 3 days per week to provide additional support if needed.
- All course work assigned (about 1 assignment per course per day) should be completed in a timely manner to meet deadlines.

Learning Coach (in most cases parents)

As a learning coach you play an important role in your student's education. You will provide academic support, motivation, and guidance throughout the school year. Along with that, you will enter and monitor their attendance and ensure they are attending all their required live classes, ensure completion of assignments as well as communicate with teachers as needed.

Below are specific learning coach roles K-2.

- Help your young learner understand what they are to do each day and how to do it.
- Spend 4-6 hours a day working with your student, at this young age it is important to be hands on with them.
- Lead offline activities to help your child develop reading and writing skills.
- Make sure your child is attending all required live classes and take attendance daily.

Grades 3rd through 5th

Students

Grades 6th through 8th (middle school)
